



## MAKE A GIFT OF GRAIN AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Hendricks Regional Health makes a difference for people in our community and you can, too! Give a gift of grain to Hendricks Regional Health Foundation and you help give the gift of good health to your family, neighbors and friends.

By donating grain, farmers help Hendricks Regional Health provide indispensable health care and often receive significant tax advantages. Cash basis farmers can achieve tax savings by donating crops directly to Hendricks Regional Health Foundation because they avoid having to include the sale of the crop in their income. However, we recommend that farmers consult with their professional tax or financial advisors to determine tax implications for their own personal situation.

### HOW DOES IT WORK?

1. Gifts of grain to charities, including Hendricks Regional Health Foundation, can be made from current or previous year's harvest.
2. The gift should be from unsold crop inventory with no prior sale commitment or lien against it.
3. The grain should be delivered with a donation form completed and mailed or faxed to Hendricks Regional Health Foundation. Several local elevators have forms or you can use the form on this flyer.
4. The grain elevator will execute a warehouse receipt in the Foundation's name showing the Foundation as the seller. HRH Foundation orders the sale of the property, and proceeds are sent to us.
5. Hendricks Regional Health Foundation will acknowledge the gift to the donor for tax purposes.
